

## Wireless at Johns Hopkins

The Johns Hopkins University has expanded its wireless service and now offers a new network “hopkins”. The “hopkins” wireless network uses strong 256 bit Advanced Encryption Standard (AES), and Microsoft Internet Authentication Service (IAS) for authentication to provide a higher level of security and access.

Access to the Johns Hopkins wireless network will require a one-time registration into the Johns Hopkins Address Registration System (JHARS). Registration on the Johns Hopkins Registration System can only be done using your account entry from the Johns Hopkins Enterprise Directory (JHED). Your account entry will require your JHED login ID (LID) and password.

### **How do I find out my JHED account information?**

#### **Step 1**

**You will need access to a wired (ethernet) connection:** your system in your dorm room, the computer lab in Krieger Hall Room 160 or the library.

#### **Step 2**

Open a web browser and go to <http://my.johnshopkins.edu>

#### **Step 3**

Click the “First Time Login” tab.

#### **Step 4**

Follow the instructions on the login page to find out your Login ID and to set your password.

#### **Step 5**

Click on the “Change My Info” tab and fill in a valid email address.

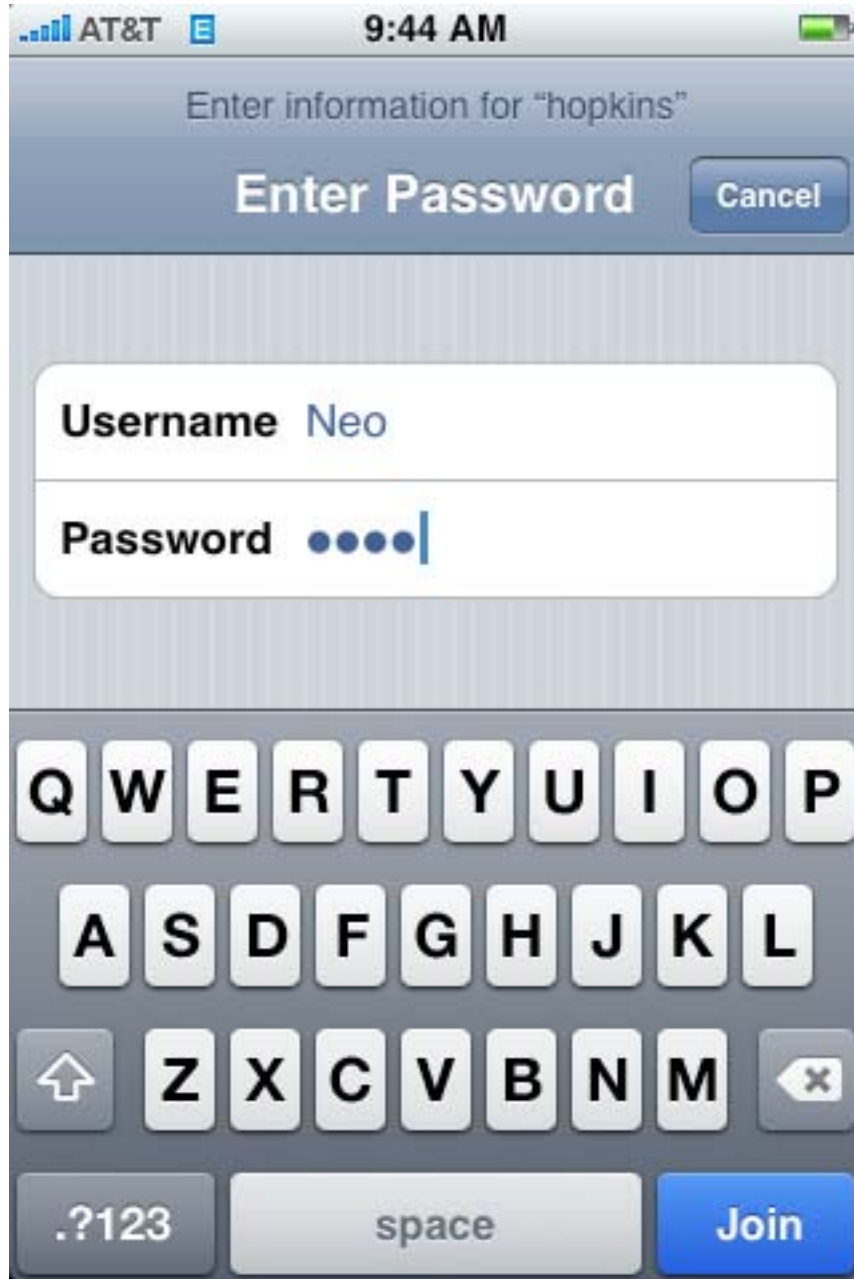
Click save.

JHED account and Active Directory credentials should be the same except for some grandfathered accounts. If you have issues with signing in when asked for your userid and password, please contact the Help Desk to correct the issue.

**Please Note: The iPhone must have version 2.0 or higher software installed. This update supports the WPA-Enterprise and 802.1X authentication.**



By selecting *settings* from the home screen and then selecting *Wi-Fi*, this will allow you to view the Wi-Fi networks that are available. At the Homewood and East Baltimore campus we broadcast the *hopkins* network SSID so you should see *hopkins* as an option.



By selecting *hopkins* the next screen will prompt you for your unique *JHED* Username and Password.



After you successfully authenticated the next screen will prompt you to accept the Equifax Secure Certificate.



This screen shows that the user has successfully connected to the *hopkins* network.



By selecting the *hopkins* tab over button you're able to view your network settings.
